6	Programme Description
	<p>Overview</p> <p>The Master of Business Administration (MBA) is a flagship programme within the Faculty of Business, Law and Tourism at the University of Sunderland. This programme will develop both current and future leaders to successfully navigate the new world of business. With a focus on leadership and professional development, international business, digital skills, and sustainability, the MBA provides a comprehensive framework for students to explore current and future leadership challenges. All of the modules on the MBA will be linked with employers to ensure that students are gaining authentic experience of challenging business issues and developing transferable skills for their future careers.</p> <p>The MBA offers a variety of pathways to suit a range of student circumstances, this includes the standard 12-month MBA, the 60-credit and 90-credit MBA ‘top ups’, the MBA (Professional Practice) which includes a 12-month placement, and the 24-month MBA with a Postgraduate Certificate. With the standard 12-month MBA at our Sunderland campus there is also an opportunity to specialise in Human Resource Management; Finance; Marketing; or Sustainability.</p> <p>Inspiring guest speakers, regular social events and opportunities to impact the local community are just some of the wider activities that MBA students can expect to be involved in as they embark on this exciting leadership journey. Students will become members of a</p>

diverse community of aspiring leaders to build lasting relationships with past, current and future MBA students from the University of Sunderland.

What's covered in the course?

MBA students will study the core module *Strategic Leadership for a Sustainable Future* which is a practical module aimed at encouraging reflection on critical leadership skills and identifying areas for development based on individual career trajectories and trends in the business environment. Students will also take modules on *Digital Enterprise and Innovation*, and *International Business in Context* to develop innovative and sustainable solutions and strategies for current and emerging international business issues.

If students opt for the standard MBA they will also study *Corporate Governance and Financial Management* to develop a rounded portfolio of knowledge and skills to take forward into the workplace. Students who opt for one of the MBA specialism routes will study modules that allow them to explore their chosen specialism in more detail, including Human Resource Management, Finance, Marketing, and Sustainability, whilst still maintaining the core strategic leadership focus of the MBA.

Students on all pathways excluding the MBA (Professional Practice) will complete the capstone *MBA Project* module. This module enables the student to critically examine a suitable topic by completing a research project into an organisation or industry sector with which they are familiar. Students on the MBA (Professional Practice) will complete the *Placement Project* module. This module enables the student to develop a critical understanding of the role and importance of research-into-business-practice by investigating an authentic business issue facing a contemporary organisation.

Where will I study?

The programme will be delivered predominantly at the University of Sunderland's St Peter's Campus. During completion of the final MBA Research Project or Placement Project students will be working independently, either in the designated Post-Graduate Research areas on campus or at another location of their choice.

University Regulation:

2.3.1 The study load for a full-time student is 180 credits per year.

New Programme Regulation:

Mode of Delivery: Students at ISMT in Nepal may complete the programme in full-time mode over 2 years.

University Regulation:

Students may be permitted to enter with advanced standing by Accreditation of Prior Learning (APL) or through an approved articulation or progression route. Such prior learning may be certificated or experiential or a combination of both. In such cases students are awarded credit for experience gained elsewhere. The approved processes

by which entry with advanced standing may be permitted are described in the Academic Quality Handbook

Addition

For the MBA (Professional Practice) APL will not be applied so as to allow an applicant direct entry onto the Professional Practice stage of the programme.

Part B Assessment Regulations

2.1.3(c) *Credit: a measure of the volume of student learning time required to achieve defined learning outcomes at a given level. A full-time postgraduate workload is 180 credits per year representing 1800 hours of notional learning time.*

Addition

For the MBA (Professional Practice) the full-time postgraduate workload is 120 credits per year representing 1200 hours of notional learning time. For the programme as a whole, this will be 240 credits in total and 2400 hours of notional learning time.

2.2.3 *Wherever possible, the standard module size is used but the following sizes are permissible:*

For the MBA (Professional Practice) the Placement Project (MGTM08) at 120 credits and 1200 learning hours is permissible

2.3.1 *The study load for a full-time student is 180 credits per year. The maximum study load for a part-time student is 140 credits per year.*

Addition

For the MBA (Professional Practice) the full-time postgraduate workload is 120 credits per year. This programme is not offered in part-time mode.

3.2 *Each student must be registered in each year of study for the programme to which he/she has been admitted and for the modules within that programme which he/she is to take. Full-time students must be registered for 180 credits per academic year. Part-time students may register for up to 140 credits.*

Addition

For the MBA (Professional Practice) the full-time postgraduate workload is 120 credits per year. This programme is not offered in part-time mode.

3.4 *A student who wishes to take additional modules must do so by registering separately for a short course. A fee is charged for this. The assessment of such modules will not contribute to the assessment of the student's primary programme of study. Such registration requires the approval of the programme/course/module leader(s) of the student's original programme and of the student's additional course of study before he/she may be allowed to register. The assessment of such additional study will not contribute to the assessment of the student's initial programme of study. A separate fee is charged for any additional study.*

Amendment

Students registered on the MBA (Professional Practice) who do not secure a placement will study the Postgraduate Certificate in Human Resource Management or the Postgraduate Certificate in Digital Marketing at no additional cost. The modules completed in furtherance of this Certificate will not contribute to the assessment of the MBA and the student may only complete the certificate as well as the MBA over the 2-year period that was the expected duration of the programme on which they were originally enrolled.

6.1.3 Exit qualifications may be awarded for all Master's degrees as Postgraduate Certificates or Diplomas of Higher Education. The name of the exit qualification shall be the same as that for the Master's degree unless an alternative name is approved at programme validation and recorded as a programme-specific regulation.

Addition

In addition to the already approved exit awards of Postgraduate Certificate/Diploma in Higher Education in Management Studies, there is an additional exit award of a Postgraduate Diploma in Higher Education in Management Studies (Professional Practice) for MBA (Professional Practice) students who achieve at least 135 credits which include the Placement Project module (MGTM08). Students in this position will not be eligible for a Postgraduate Diploma in Higher Education in Management Studies.

6.4.1a A Master's degree is awarded for the achievement of 180 credits at Level 7 as required by the programme regulations.

Addition

For the MBA (Professional Practice), a Master's degree is awarded for the achievement of 240 credits at Level 7.

6.4.1b A classification of Merit or Distinction is awarded on the basis of a weighted mean average of the module marks for all credits obtained at Level 7. If that average is 70% or higher, then a Distinction will be awarded. If that average is 60% or higher, then a Merit will be awarded.

Clarification

Regulation 6.4.1b applies equally to the MBA (Professional Practice) i.e. the full 240 credits will be taken into account in calculating the classification of the award.
